What does a Health Information Technician do?

A Health Information Technician compiles and maintains the medical records of patients to document their conditions and treatments and to provide data for research studies.

Where does a Health Information Technician work?

Health Information/Medical Record Technicians work in hospitals, ambulatory care centers, mental health facilities, insurance companies, hospice, rehabilitative hospitals, correctional facilities, veterinary medicine, cancer registry and other health related agencies.

Employment Outlook

Employment opportunities for the Health Information Technician is expected to grow much faster than the average due to the rapid growth in the number of medical tests, treatments and procedures and because medical records/health information will be increasingly scrutinized by third-party payers, courts and consumers.
