## Basic RiderCourse (BRC) - Web Enhanced | Beginning Riders

This course is designed for someone who has little or no experience operating a motorcycle, and it focuses on the development of basic riding skills: clutch and throttle coordination, straight-line riding, braking, turning, and shifting. Training motorcycles are provided. Privately owned motorcycles are NOT permitted. The course also provides a fast track to motorcycle endorsement (CY); successful completion results in a certificate that waives the written knowledge test and riding-skill test, which would otherwise be administered by the Secretary of State and a third-party testing agency, respectively.

Instruction consists of approximately 17 total hours - 5 hours of online preparation to be completed prior to your class start date and 12 hours of hands-on training, activities, evaluation, and testing. Standard Weekend students need to be available, but not necessarily on-site, for all of Saturday and Sunday. Students are placed into groups on Friday; Group A rides in the morning, and Group B rides in the afternoon on Saturday/Sunday. Please reserve any requests for your instructor on Friday AFTER CLASS.

#### **Prerequisites**

- · Ability to ride a bicycle.
- Valid email address on file with the College. Must complete the online eCourse prior to your class start date and bring the completion certificate to the first class session. The link to the eCourse will be distributed by the College via email at least one week prior to the start date of your class. #### eCOURSE INFORMATION: MSF ePACKAGE 1x11

The MSF ePackage 1x11 eCourse (online component) is a required pre-course assignment for all Basic RiderCourses (BRC) - Web Enhanced

Information pertaining to the eCourse will be emailed to all students approximately 1-3 weeks prior to the class start date. This email will include:

- The registration link for the eCourse
- Instructions for enrolling in the eCourse
- Instructions for accessing and completing the eCourse

To ensure you receive the eCourse information, you must provide a valid, updated email address during registration with the College. The eCourse MUST be completed prior to the start of your class and the completion certificate must be shown to your RiderCoach upon arrival.

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## Basic RiderCourse 2 (BRC2) - Web Enhanced | Experienced Riders

This course is designed mainly for experienced but unendorsed motorcyclists; however, endorsed motorcyclists also use this course to refresh their skills. Topics include: braking, countersteering, turning, speed judgment, and other techniques necessary for the experienced rider to operate a motorcycle skillfully and safely. Students must provide their own motorcycle. Mopeds are welcome. Three-wheeled motorcycles are NOT permitted. Sharing is NOT permitted. The motorcycle must be titled, registered, and insured; and it must display a valid license plate. Students must provide proof of insurance, and the motorcycle must pass a safety inspection. The course also provides a fast track to motorcycle endorsement (CY); successful completion results in a certificate that waives the written knowledge test and riding-skill test, which would otherwise be administered by the Secretary of State and a third-party testing agency, respectively.

Instruction consists of 11 total hours: 4 hours of online preparation to be completed prior to your class start date and 11 hours of hands-on training, activities, evaluations, and testing.

#### <u>Prerequisites</u>

- Prior motorcycling experience.
- Ownership of a motorcycle that is titled, registered, and insured.
- Valid email address on file with the College. Must complete the online eCourse prior to your class start date and bring the completion certificate to the first class session. The link to the eCourse will be distributed by the College via email at least one week prior to the start date of your class. If you have not received an email by this time, you must contact the PPL office at (734) 462-4448.

# Advanced RiderCourse (ARC) | Experienced, Endorsed Riders

This course is designed for experienced, endorsed motorcyclists to enhance their basic skills and help with personal risk assessment. Interactive classroom activities to improve perception and hazard awareness are combined with range exercises that enhance both basic skills and crash-avoidance skills. You will also learn how to improve braking and cornering finesse. This is the public version of the Military SportBike RiderCourse. Students must provide their own motorcycle. Mopeds are NOT permitted. Three-wheeled motorcycles are NOT permitted. Sharing is NOT permitted. The motorcycle must be titled, registered, and insured; and it must display a valid license plate. Students must provide proof of insurance, and the motorcycle must pass a safety inspection.

#### Prerequisites

- Motorcycle endorsement.
- Ownership of a motorcycle that is titled, registered, and insured.
- Considerable street-riding miles.
- Valid email address on file with the College.
