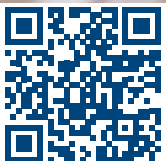

Register for Courses **WITH** your Education Plan

1. Go to *Ocelot Access* at: schoolcraft.edu/OcelotAccess
2. Click the Traditional Credit Student card
3. Log-in
4. Click the Register and Drop Courses card
5. Click the Registration and Student Planning card
6. Click the right arrow next to the term until you reach the desired term.
7. Under the listed courses on the left side, click *View Other Sections*.
8. The sections will be listed below the course. Use the arrows to navigate to view each section.
9. Click *Filter Sections* to narrow your search (including days, times, locations, online, availability).
10. Select the course and view section details; Click *Add Section* (the section will show up on your calendar).
11. Click the *Register Now* button above the calendar to register (the course will turn green on your calendar).

Register for Courses **WITHOUT** an Education Plan

1. Follow steps numbered 1 – 5 listed above.
2. Type the name(s) of the course and the course number (or just the subject) in the search bar and click the *Search Button* or *Enter*.
3. Select the course and click *Add Course to Plan*. Do this for each of the courses you want to take.
4. Return to *Plan and Schedule*. Follow steps numbered 7 – 11 above.

ADMITTED STUDENT CHECKLIST

Follow these steps to ensure that you are ready to register and start classes.

New Student Password Setup

If you are a first-time student at Schoolcraft, you will need to create your New Student Password. Go to schoolcraft.edu/newstudentpassword.

You will use your username and password to login to SC Mail, Ocelot Access, Scholarship Universe, WI-FI and more.

Log In To Your SC mail Email Account

Log in to schoolcraft.edu/OcelotAccess. On the **My Info** card, click on **log in to your student email**.

The college will send all important communications, such as financial aid, to this email address. Be sure to check it often.

Submit Transcripts

First Year Students

Request to have your high school transcripts sent through parchment.com or email your transcripts to admissions@schoolcraft.edu.

Transfer Students

Official college transcripts must be sent directly from the transfer institution to Schoolcraft.

Submit Test Scores or Take a Placement Test

First Year Students

Have you taken the SAT or ACT within the last 3 years?

Yes: Request SAT scores at collegeboard.org and/or ACT scores at act.org/the-act/scores, or email your Score Report to admissions@schoolcraft.edu

No: Make sure you have the most recent version of your high school transcript sent to Schoolcraft College then call Advising to discuss your next steps. You may be asked to take our placement test.

Transfer Students

If transferring credits, call Advising at 734-462-4429 to determine if you need to take a Placement Test.

Complete New Student Orientation

Orientation is mandatory for first-time college students. Complete orientation at schoolcraft.edu/orientation.

Orientation is not required for transfer students.

Make an Academic Advising Appointment

Schedule an appointment with an Academic Advisor by calling 734-462-4429. Please have your student ID number available.

Register for Classes

Login to Ocelot Access to register for classes at schoolcraft.edu/OcelotAccess

With Ocelot Access you can:

- Search, register, waitlist, drop, and pay for classes.
- Set up a tuition payment plan or make an international payment.
- Check on financial aid and get important dates.
- Access your student education plan and get information on transfer and degree requirements.
- View student records, including billing statements, unofficial transcripts, and enrollment verifications.

Pay for Classes

Payment is due within 3 business days, including holidays, from the date of registration.

If you do not pay in full, have financial aid in place, or commit to our payment plan option, you could be dropped from your classes for non-payment. It is your responsibility to drop your classes if you are not planning to attend, even if you have a Financial Aid award on your offer letter in Ocelot Access greater than zero.

- **In Person:** Go to the Cashier's Office located in the McDowell Student Center. Visa, MasterCard, Discover, American Express, debt cards, checks and cash are accepted.

- **Tuition Payment Plan:** Get payment plan information at schoolcraft.edu/payments.

REGISTRATION TIPS

Waitlist: If a course is full, you can add your name to a waitlist. If a spot becomes available, the first student on the waitlist will be notified via Schoolcraft email. Notifications go out each day at 6 a.m. If you receive a notification, you will have until the following day at 11 p.m. to register for that class. If you do not register, the seat will be offered to the next student on the waitlist.

Late Entry/Overload: Students wishing to register for a class after it has met for the first time (late entry), or want to try to get into a class that is full (overload), need written approval from the instructor.

Please visit schoolcraft.edu/registration/overload-and-late-entry for more details.

Schedule Adjustment: During the first week of the term, you can adjust your schedule as needed, including Late Entry and Overload classes.

Prerequisites: A prerequisite is a condition that students are required to meet before registering for a class. For example, a class that must be taken before taking another class. Students must complete prerequisites as required before enrolling in some courses. Contact your academic advisor for assistance.

DETERMINE TUITION AND FEES

Payment is due within 3 business days, including holidays, from the date of registration.

If you do not pay in full, have financial aid in place, or commit to our payment plan option, you could be dropped from your classes for non-payment. You are responsible for dropping any classes you are not attending, even if you have a Financial Aid award on your offer letter in Ocelot Access greater than zero.

Use the table on page 3 to determine your tuition and fees. Locate the number of credit hours you will be taking for the term, then go to the Total Column for Resident or Non-Resident Rates. The total includes all fees as outlined in the table.

The college verifies a student's residency at admission and for each semester's registration. To qualify for Resident Tuition Rates, students must reside within Schoolcraft College's district, which includes the public school districts of Clarenceville, Garden City, Livonia, Northville, Plymouth- Canton and part of Novi.

FINANCIAL AID AND COLLEGE FEES

FINANCIAL AID

The first step in qualifying for Financial Aid is to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at fafsa.gov.

Schoolcraft's FAFSA code is 002315.

Once a student qualifies for Financial Aid, it is applied to the student's account each semester based on the start date of classes to pay for tuition and fees. Any excess funds can then be used to purchase books and necessary class supplies at the Schoolcraft Bookstore.

Schoolcraft College students may qualify for one of the following financial aid programs:

Grants

A grant is a form of financial aid that does not have to be repaid. It is based primarily on demonstrated financial need.

Scholarships

Generally based on academic merit or particular area of study and does not have to be repaid. Apply for Schoolcraft Scholarships at schoolcraft.edu/scholarships. The FAFSA may not be a requirement for all scholarships.

Work Study

Students are placed in jobs on campus and wages are paid in part by the work-study program. For more information, contact Career Services at 734-462-4421 or email careerservices@schoolcraft.edu.

Student Loans

You must complete a FAFSA application to qualify for student loans. If you would like to request a student loan, you must submit a Loan Request Form. Information and steps are found at schoolcraft.edu/aid/loans. All student loans must be repaid after graduation or not maintaining half time enrollment.

- The Financial Aid Department will send financial aid information to only your SCmail account.
- The FAFSA must be completed every year that you wish to apply for Financial Aid. The FAFSA usually is available beginning October 1st each year.

FEE DESCRIPTIONS

Registration Fee

This fee is a refundable fee charged one time per semester regardless of how many credit hours a student registers for during the semester. This fee is \$44 per semester.

Service Fee

This fee defrays the cost of several free services that Schoolcraft provides to students, such as career services, student activities, graduation, parking and admittance to the SC Fitness Center each semester the student is registered. This fee is \$9 per credit.

Lab Fees/Learning Management Fees

This fee is used to cover the cost of special materials, equipment, student assistants, specialized support and other services. Our learning management system fee (currently Blackboard) is \$12 per class, with an additional fee of \$10 for classes held in computer labs, allowing the use of additional technology that is otherwise not available in a standard classroom.

Excess Contact Hours Fees

The College charges \$139 per excess contact hour with a maximum of 4 excess contact hours per class. An excess contact hour occurs when the weekly class meeting hours exceed the class credit hours. For example, if Biology meets 4 hours per week, but Biology is a 3 credit hour class, the student is charged a \$139 excess contact hour fee. If a Nursing class meets 10 hours per week, but the Nursing class is a 4 credit hour class, the student will be charged a \$556 excess contact hour fee.

Instructional Equipment Fee

This fee is used to defray the increasing cost of maintaining, upgrading, and replacing the wide variety of electronic equipment and personal computers used in our classrooms. Software purchases, maintenance agreements, and upgrades are also covered by this fee. Every student is charged \$11 per credit hour for this fee.

Infrastructure Fee

This fee is used to defray the increasing costs associated with maintaining and enhancing the College's buildings, facilities, and campus grounds. Deferred maintenance and depreciation of campus infrastructure is also covered by this fee. Every student is charged \$9 per credit hour for this fee.

COURSE FORMATS

Traditional (On Campus)

Traditional courses include set meeting times held live on a physical campus. Traditional courses require students to attend and actively participate in on-campus class sessions for the duration of the semester.

Online (ONL)

Online (ONL) courses do not include set meeting times but will have assignment deadlines. ONL courses require students to log in to a learning management system and consistently participate in each online course section during a given semester. Participation includes engaging in module activities, interacting in asynchronous online discussions, and submitting assignments within the course by their respective due dates. Assignments may include online group projects to further build community and mimic real-world experiences. NOTE: Online MATH courses require several on-campus proctored exams.

Synchronous Remote (SYNC)

Synchronous remote (SYNC) courses include set meeting times with each meeting held as a live virtual session via a web conferencing tool. SYNC courses require students to log in, attend, and participate in each SYNC live class session during a given semester. Active participation includes engaging in live discussions and submitting completed assignments in the course by their respective due dates. Assignments may include online group projects to further build community and mimic real-world experiences.

Hybrid (HYB)

Hybrid (HYB) courses combine on-campus live set meeting times and asynchronous online course work. HYB courses require students to attend and participate in the live on-campus classroom sessions, as scheduled. The asynchronous online course portion does not include set meeting times on-campus or via live web conferencing. Students participate in asynchronous online discussions and submit completed assignments in the course by their respective due dates. Assignments may include online group projects to further build community and mimic real-world experiences.

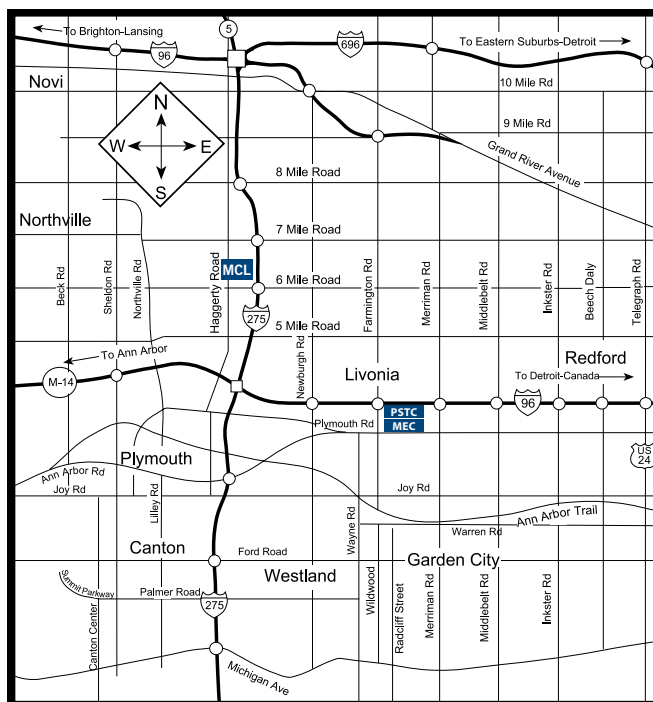
